## Newsletter July 2018



### Kindergarten 1

During Term 2 in Kindergarten One, the children were very busy learning and exploring.

This term children continued to learn about emotional regulation, social skills and friendship building through an inquiry project. Our favourite hand puppet friends (George and Avana) visited us many times to demonstrate how to modulate emotions during a range of social situations including conflict. We extended this inquiry to support children building positive identities and to teach them to accept, understand and value people regardless of physical differences, physical abilities, and the languages they speak. We incorporated a range of resources and strategies to facilitate this learning such as, role plays, discussions, and books. The following are a few books that we utilised:



Role playing and learning about the human body at the hospital dramatic play station, imaginative play at the dinosaur world learning station and exploring letter symbols with play dough were some of our much-loved learning experiences this term.

We made sure to spend extended time exploring our beautiful outdoor gardens playing with nature as much as possible. The children had so much fun collecting, raking,

throwing and scrunching the amazingly colourful autumn leaves and at times gold colours leaves were pretended as pirate treasure.

As the term progressed, the children began to engage in an inquiry project to explore Indigenous culture. 'I'm Australian too' by Mem Fox. This book helped the children to understand that the Indigenous people are the traditional custodians of the land. To extend this learning, we now we acknowledge Aboriginal people every day during our morning meeting.

We are looking forward to delve further into this topic in Term 3.

#### **Kindergarten 2**

The Kindergarten Two children have had a very busy Term 2! We began by exploring Anzac Day commemorations, and made our own Anzac biscuits according to the traditional recipe used during World War 1. It was also wonderful to see so many of our mothers, grandmothers and other special people at our Mothers' Day Afternoon Tea in May.

This term, we have placed an emphasis on social learning through our exploration of the text "Have You Filled A Bucket Today?" by Carol McLeod. We discussed how our words and actions can affect others, and we have incorporated the language used in the text into our Kindergarten environment. We then explored ways in which we can all be "Bucket Fillers" and created our own "Bucket Filling" chart to support us in this regard.

To finish up the term, the Kindergarten Two



children explored Indigenous culture through acknowledging Reconciliation Week. To extend this celebration, we explored Indigenous culture. We investigated Indigenous languages and talked about how the Aboriginal people had their own languages, and how the Wurundjeri people spoke the Woiworrung language. We also discussed how different Aboriginal tribes had their own stories. We listened to a traditional Wurundjeri story called "How the Platypus was Made". We used these stories to learn some words in the Woiwurrung language.

The children looked at how Indigenous people communicated with each other through paintings. We discussed how the Indigenous people painted using materials they sourced from the environment. We decided to make our own paintings using some materials that we found outside.

I have had a fabulous time working with the children in Term 1 and Term 2 this year and will shortly commence my maternity leave.

#### Pre Prep

What an eventful term it has been in Pre Prep. Throughout Term 2, the Pre Prep children continued to engage in cultural inquiries, exploring two countries; Australia (May) and South Africa (June). Inquiries such as these, broaden children's understanding of the world in which they live and provide opportunities to explore the diversity of culture, heritage, background and tradition.

- Whilst exploring Australia discussions and experiences centered around topics such as native animals, ANZAC's flags, instruments, the traditional owners, indigenous art and symbols. At the end of our inquiry children were then invited to transfer what they had learnt to create their own indigenous inspired story paintings.
- Whilst exploring South Africa, discussions and experiences centered around music and animals. Children were invited to dramatise in a large safari setting. This allows children the opportunity to engage in dramatic play and support the children in their co-operative play and processes of sustained shared thinking in play. At group times the children were

introduced to a Large African Djembe Drum, and musical instruments were on offer in the room to extend on children's interest in music and African culture.

Our interest in countries and cultures of the world has led us to a large group project exploring concepts surrounding geography and maps. The Pre Preps have begun to map postcards we have received from around the world onto large wall maps. The children enjoy receiving postcards and leaning about each country it is from.

## Sustainability: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle


